



Visit Dryandra and Explore WA Nature

If you're looking for a great place to head 'out bush', consider visiting Dryandra Woodland. It's only two hours south of Perth, simple to get to and is home to a variety of native wildlife including the Numbat.

If you want to stay overnight inside Dryandra, there are a couple of accommodation options including Dryandra Lions Village or head to the Congelin Camp Site.

You can explore the woodlands on walking trails or go to the Barna Mia compound which is a fenced sanctuary for native wildlife where you can spotlight for animals at night.

If you do go to Dryandra, take along a Fauna Spotting Log which can be downloaded from our website. This is DEC's own form and can be used to record wildlife you encounter. And of course, if you see a Numbat, let us know about it too.
