In December 2013 Project Numbat presented a unique opportunity to members to participate in a Digging Survey Workshop, led by Dr Tony Friend, a principal research scientist with DPaW.

Animal diggings are a useful tool if identified correctly. Numbat diggings have certain characteristics, and when combined with scat identification, give an accurate record of numbat presence without having to get a visual on the animals themselves.

The workshop was the first step towards our goal of developing a network of surveyors. Our long term aim is to train members to confidently and accurately identify signs of numbats and then use this team to be able to increase the frequency of surveys conducted.

Radio Collar Fundraiser

Our collar fundraiser is now in its fifth year and continues to be a great success! Each year, wild or captive born numbats are fitted with radio collars by the Department of Parks and Wildlife (DPaW) to track their movements, gain important information on their dispersal in their habitat and their survival.

We give you the opportunity to be a part of this important work by contributing to the cost of the radio-collars. Each collar costs \$250 and for your contribution you receive a certificate with a photo of the collared numbat, its name, date of birth (if known), sex, weight and location.
